Christian Aid Week: standing with refugees like Nejebar

Nejebar and her family have fled horrors in Afghanistan, where her husband was threatened with torture and death for being a government worker. But now they've arrived in Greece, all they have is a tent. They have no other protection against wind and rain. There's no school for their five children



protection against wind and rain. There's no school for their five children. They have no certainty or clear idea of what will happen to them now. They thought they would stay there for 10 days, but it's already been six months and there's no end in sight.

You've helped us be there for refugees since 1945

Thanks to you, Christian Aid has been there for refugees like Nejebar since 1945, providing essential food, shelter and legal assistance for people far from home. We still believe in life before death.

From 14-20 May, our church will join with more than 20,000 others across the country for the sake of people like Nejebar and her family. Across the UK and Ireland Christian Aid will deliver 7 million envelopes to local neighbours to raise money for our global neighbours in need. It's an opportunity to reach out to our community and to make sure some of the world's poorest people have enough to eat and a safe place to live.

In a past life I was Dorothy Kennedy, teacher and later Scripture Union Staff worker in Glasgow. Now I am Deacon Pink! How did this happen?

Well....I was minding my own business as a happy wife to David Getliffe, Railway Signaller, and a Mum to two daughters aged 10 and 8, when I realised God wanted me out of the house and back into some form of ministry! After a Vocations Conference, I knew I had been called to the Diaconate, or to be a Deacon.

After jumping through the same hoops and training as a Minister of Word and Sacrament, my first job was as Locum Pastoral Assistant in Wishaw. Subsequently I went on to be an Adult and Family Worker full time in the same deprived area of Cambusnethan.

There followed a wonderful time in a ministry team with the (now retired) Rev Ronnie Craig in Shettleston, where my job spec was "Development Coordinator." This challenging post included fundraising, starting two more Carer and Tots Groups, as well as the usual parts of leading Sunday Worship and conducting funerals when Ronnie was on holiday. I loved this job and still enjoy hearing from folks from the east end of Glasgow.

As the girls were now in secondary school and at what can be a tricky stage of adolescence, I decided to drop full time and took on the part time role of Family Networker in a Fresh Expression of Church. It was based in one of the most affluent parts of south Glasgow, where we met in a Rugby Club and tried to reach new families for whom Church was no longer relevant.

Since then, my children have become students - the younger, Mary Jo, is a fledgling Staff Nurse and the older, Dawn, still a medical student in Dundee.

I've enjoyed being locum in two more Glasgow charges. Now you are up to date and here I am! My chillaxing time is spent doing jigsaws, reading, seeing musical theatre and playing badminton. I look forward to getting to know you all and serving God alongside your Minister in Mannofield and the wider community. Please come and introduce yourself to me so I can soon put a face to a name!

"PENTECOST IN THE PARK" – LOCAL CHURCHES TO HOLD VERY SPECIAL BIRTHDAY BASH!

Six local churches, including ours, are closing their doors on Sunday 4 June and going for a picnic!

In what may well be a first for Kirks in Aberdeen, six congregations have got together to host "Pentecost in the Park". The park is Hazlehead and we're planning a one-off praise event, with a joint choir and an ever-growing orchestra all pitching in to guarantee a very special occasion.

The congregations of Craigiebuckler, Cults, Holburn West, Kingswells, Mannofield and Peterculter will **NOT** be opening their doors for worship on that Pentecost Sunday. With the full approval of all six Kirk sessions and Aberdeen Presbytery, we will instead worship together—in Hazlehead Park—to celebrate the birthday of Christ's Church because that's exactly what Pentecost is: the birth-day of Christ's Church.

A fleet of cars and coaches from all six locations will converge on Hazlehead Park for "Pentecost in the Park". Our worship will be at midday and then, because the weather is bound to be wonderful (!), it's picnic time.

Imagine six congregations getting together in this way to praise the Lord and pass the sandwiches! Imagine what an amazing witness it will be, to praise our Lord on Pentecost and in the very same moment show publicly and joyfully that "Jesus Christ is Lord!"

But what we need, most of all is you. Don't see 4 June as a Sunday off. And please don't see it as a novelty turn; nothing could be further from the truth. "Pentecost in the Park" is a superb opportunity to honour Christ and celebrate the faith we hold in common.

Here's what everyone needs to know:

Each congregation will make its own arrangements about sharing transport etc but two coaches will visit all six churches, to collect anyone of any age who doesn't have alternative transport - and bring you back. No charge!

Everyone meets at their local church at 11am, before making their way to Hazlehead or waiting for the coaches.

The service will be at 12 noon, followed by a picnic.

Please bring picnic food with you and, if possible, fold-up seats and blankets There will be children's activities – so bring the weans!

If the weather turns nasty, everything will relocate to Craigiebuckler Church.

Your minister and session clerk will keep you posted on precise details as the day draws closer.


