Message from Keith

Dear Friends



One year into the presidency of Donald Trump most of us are not surprised anymore by the unusual way he chooses to conduct his presidency.

He recently announced his 'Fake News Awards'. He used this gimmick to escalate his attacks on media. The article published on the Republican Party Web Page began, *'2017 was a year of unrelenting bias, unfair news coverage and even downright fake news. Studies have shown that over 90% of the media's coverage of President Trump is negative.'*

The battleground for 'truth' has always been a feature of communication within the arenas of society. Words are used to convey truth and opponents with differing outlooks and agendas use words to convince the masses of the validity of their diverse claims. Words backed up with proof, witness testimony, first hand accounts and other evidence gathered have a tendency to sound more convincing.

Reviewing the battleground of the biblical 1st century we can recognise that the opponents to Jesus 'New Way', sought to deploy the 'Trump Card' of allegations of 'Fake News' to neutralise the movement of Jesus' followers and adherents and to protect their own interest. Herod the Temple officials and others sought to debunk the whole legitimacy of the Incarnation of God's Son, as well as the new teaching and culture of love and equality that Jesus was establishing.

Thankfully we recognise that despite the attempts of those who would derail God's intervention through Jesus, God by the power of His Spirit prevailed and does prevail to this day.

When I look to the Church of today I am heartened by the work I see in so many places. We are part of a Church that knows the need for continued evolution and change - sometimes subtle, sometimes gigantic - as it strives towards the promotion of the Good News (not Fake News) of God's Love for all in ways that are meaningful and appropriate for the times we live in and the challenges faced.

We in Mannofield are part of the work of Good News sharing. What a wonderful responsibility it is for us to know ourselves called to play a part in God's Mission to the world.

CONGREGATION IS GENEROUS IN OFFERING LIFTS TO CHURCH

According to a survey on 14 January, 139 people attended church that morning. Three out of every four people arrived by car, whereas one in four walked. The weather was miserable, which may have deterred a few who would otherwise have walked.

On average, the journey took 7 minutes on foot and 9 minutes for car drivers. Car passengers reported an average time of only 6 minutes, implying that quite a few were offered a lift to church. At least 18 cars had only a single occupant, and we probably occupied 62 car parking spaces in the vicinity.

The Eco Congregation Committee hopes to repeat the exercise occasionally to see whether any trends emerge.



CrossReach was launched in June 2005 and was previously known as the Church of Scotland Board of Social Responsibility. Under its new name, CrossReach continues the Church of Scotland's long tradition of providing care and support. In fact, this work started back in 1869, so it has a long history in the field of social care.



It employs more than 2,000 staff and supports some of the most vulnerable people in Scotland. CrossReach has an annual expenditure of £51 million. Most of its funding comes from local authorities, but it also relies on donations and legacies to help continue its vital work.

CrossReach (the Church of Scotland Social Care Council) reports each year to the General Assembly and has the following remit:

- To offer services in Christ's name to people in need as part of the Church's mission.
- To provide specialist resources to further the caring work of the Church
- To identify existing and emerging areas of need, to guide the Church in pioneering new approaches to relevant problems and to make responses on issues arising within the areas of the Council's concern through appropriate channels such as the Church and Society Council, the Scottish Executive and the like.
