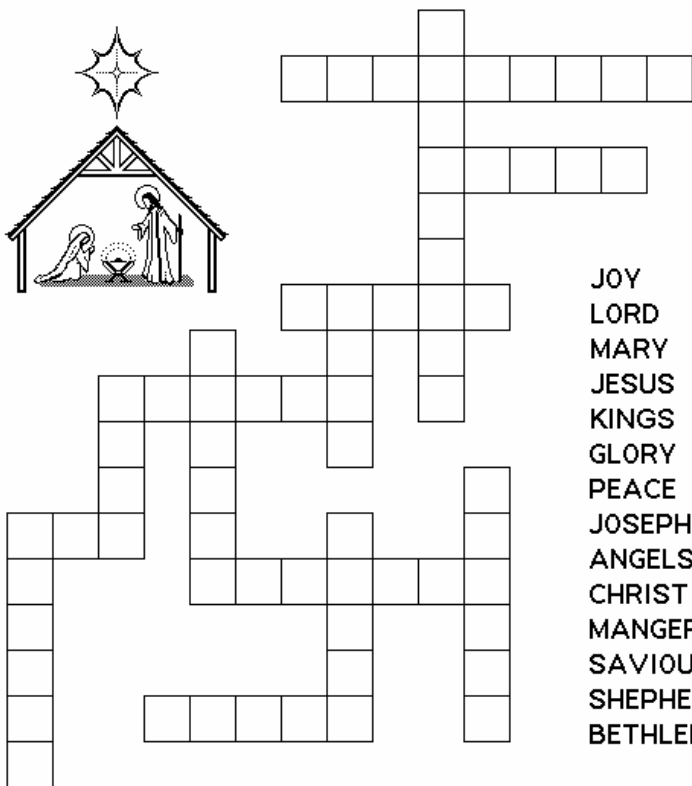

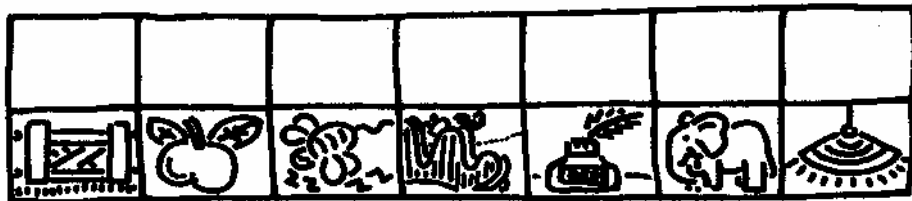

Eco update



Dear Friend

Having recently attended a Waste Aware talk at Queens Cross Church it was sobering to hear some of the statistics regarding the amount of waste we “throw away” each year.

1. Aberdonians throw away 90,000 tons of rubbish each year into our local landfill site.
2. This equates to 9,000 refuse trucks
3. Laid end to end they would reach from Aberdeen to Forfar!
4. Unfortunately the council is closing the local landfill site in December. This will force the waste to be transported to Peterhead!

9,000 trucks x 60 mile round trip = 540,000 extra miles (and CO2 emissions) every year.

It is heartening to know that we are changing the majority's habits with the increase in green recycling initiatives but clearly, from these numbers, we have a long way to go.

Within Mannofield Church there are a number of recycling points for us to use, but we would like to do more by focusing on the congregation's needs.

Within the next few weeks we will be distributing a lifestyle questionnaire at the end of the pews.

It would be very helpful if you can spare a couple of minutes before or after the service to fill it in.

From this information we hope we can map the lifestyle trends of the congregation and use this positively to add to our Eco congregation goals -- improving our own personal sustainability and contribution to the wider stewardship of Earth.

Currently we have 40 boys across all Sections.

Anchor Boys - a lively bunch.

Two new helpers joined this session. Both are Company Section boys who were discharged in May and have come back to help with a view to becoming qualified leaders. Anchor Boy's activities include dodgeball and helicopter where the boys stand in a circle and have to jump over a rope as it rotates round. Great fun but dizzy work for the staff. More craft work is being done and recently the boys made firework pictures using crayons, chalk and glitter on black paper.

Junior Section— numbers are a bit lower this year but they have been enthusiastic despite this. Sport plays an important part for them and they have enjoyed playing unihoc, football and basketball. The weekly joke competition provides a laugh for the staff and points are awarded for it along with inspection. Following a discussion about Remembrance Day on 11 November the boys played a game where they had to silently guess when 2 minutes had passed. One boy was spot on standing up exactly on the 2 minute mark. They also watched an online video from Poppy Scotland.

Company Section—enthusiastic as ever. Each week they enjoy a variety of games, sports, Bible teaching and badge classes. Recent topics include Crime Prevention, the Police, Space, Money and Fundraising. Some of the boys have helped organise the recent Vie at Home fundraiser for BB mums. We have 4 Queens Badge candidates this session and so far they have planned and run a BB night back in October. We have taken part in the Battalion Table Tennis competition and hope to enter a Basketball team in December's competition.
