

Dear Friends, in preparing a school lesson for Easter that included a section on world traditions associated with Easter, I came across one I had not heard of before. It is a tradition in Sweden and is called Skärtorsdag - a name given in Sweden to Maundy Thursday. Amongst other meanings the word Skär can mean 'to clean or make pure'. In terms of Maundy Thursday then it refers to the story about Jesus washing the disciples' feet before the last supper.

The tradition is that children dress up in old clothes – usually long skirts, aprons and scarves or black suits, top hats and fake moustaches. Faces are painted with red cheeks and freckles. These 'Easter Witches' visit homes (much like our traditions of Halloween), presenting Easter cards and wishing people a Happy Easter and in return they receive sweets for their baskets.

Like other traditions associated with Easter - such as painted eggs, flying kites, bonfires, colourful rug weaving and the Easter Bunny, it is interesting how traditions from outside Christianity have been picked up and patched in with the Christian celebration of Easter.

Sometimes it is hard to separate the popular secular traditions from the message that the Church would like to share with the world in the Season. There is nothing wrong with a bit of fun around our Christian festivals such as Christmas and Easter. It is good to build up excitement and encourage family fun and a break from the sometimes mundane rhythms of normal life.

But, in and around these other traditions, the Easter Season remains a hugely important time of year for the worldwide Church and Easter Sunday is a huge day of Worship attendance at churches around the globe. A lot of work goes in to building up the expectations and spirit of the Season through the 6 weeks of Lent. Holy Week itself is the busiest week in the church calendar with Services every night. A lot of preparation goes in to getting the message of the Easter Season right and the time commitment to the various Worship Services is extensive.

Yet it is all worth it and Easter remains hugely important. In today's busy life with lots of traditions and the competition for airtime a real issue, the message of Christian Easter must not be lost on the world or the people in our communities. It comes with a message of God's Love for all people and the Resurrection promise of new life and new hope through Christ and His risen Spirit. This message is one we very much need to hear in our lives and then share it with our brothers and sisters in our communities and in our world.
