History

In 1880, the first approach was made to Aberdeen Presbytery for permission to set up a new congregation at Mannofield with the church situated at Countesswells Road. This was realised with the vision, determination and generosity of Mr. William Gordon.

Rev. C.C. McDonald conducted the first service on 27 February 1881 in a temporary wooden

The Rev. William Forbes was inducted on 10 March 1881 and work on the new church buildings was started with a seating capacity of 700 (now 635).

The Rev. Dr H. Story who later became Principal of Glasgow University, opened the building familiar to us today on 30 July 1882. The desired status as a parish church was granted to Mannofield in March 1882.
