Dear Friends.

Very soon we will celebrate Easter.

Within the Christian calendar the season of Lent/Easter sits very prominently alongside Advent/Christmas. Easter itself connects us to big words like Crucifixion and Resurrection and connects into themes such as God's Sacrificial Love and God's unconditional Grace for all humanity.

Whilst the big grand words and themes of Easter are fine to ponder upon, I find my greatest comfort, hope and strength, in what we might call the broader significance of all that Easter invites us to consider.

It's relevance for me in everyday life is found more in my understanding of what we might call the metaphors of Easter. By this phrase, I mean the general message of the season that underlies and underpins all the theological and 'churchy' language.

Easter in the context of my faith and life is a reminder of new life; the possibility of hope even in despair; opportunity found in stagnancy; faith and trust amid doubt; and death not being the end. Easter for me reminds me not to give up when all else is falling apart. It leads me to believe in God who makes new things possible time and time again in life. During life's challenges, Easter speaks to me of the renewed confidence I need to keep believing that positive change and outcomes are possible - both in my life and indeed the context of society and world.

In our troubled world we pray for Peace in Ukraine and in the Middle East. We pray for our Health Services and Care in the Community to better resource the support that people need in our own country. We pray for a Church in Scotland that is fighting hard to retain its strength in mission and relevancy. We pray for all people and whatever ails them, and whatever challenges are being endured in personal life, that there might be lighter days ahead.

The reason we celebrate Easter Sunday so passionately, is not simply because it is the conclusion of an ancient story of God. It is that Death

was defeated and Jesus rose to Life. We celebrate because Easter reminds us of the goodness and greatness of God and because it makes clear to us what God enables through His love. That gives us courage, hope and faith for the everyday realities of our human existence.

THANK YOU—it has made a big difference to the charities.



'We would like to take the opportunity to express our sincere thanks to you all for the incredible support you provided to us as part of our Christmas 24 campaign and throughout the whole year.

As we return to work for 2025, we have had time to reflect on our campaign and wanted you to be the first to hear the figures of what we achieved. It is a sad reflection of the times that charities such as us have to publish such large figures, however thanks to donations such as yours we were able to buy enough food to ensure that we could help everyone who reached out to us for support.

- 2,026 individuals received large food parcels to see them through to the new year
- 44,352 meals were provided
 - 141 emergency food parcels were placed around the city
- 700 care packages were distributed to Asylum Seekers
 - 322 Christmas eve bags were given to our youngest clients
- 639 children received Christmas presents
 - 107 single parents received a Christmas gift and motivational message of support

Our clients were delighted and humbled by the support they received, so on behalf of Somebody Cares and our clients we wish you once again thank you for your support, Somebody Cares'
